## PRESEASON GAME 1: 49ERS VS. RAVENS

AUG. 7, 2014 • 7:30 P.M. ET • M&T BANK STADIUM (71,008)



### JUST THE FACTS

• The Baltimore Ravens kick off their preseason slate on Thursday, Aug. 7, at M&T Bank Stadium in a 7:30 p.m. showdown against the San Francisco 49ers. Guided by head coach **John Harbaugh**, Baltimore has advanced to the AFC Championship game in three of the past six seasons, while the **Jim Harbaugh**-led 49ers have played in an impressive three-consecutive NFC title games. This battle marks the first meeting between the two clubs since the Ravens emerged victorious, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII on Feb. 3, 2013.

• The Ravens look to rebound from an 8-8 campaign in 2013 after missing the playoffs for the first time since **John Harbaugh's** 2008 Baltimore arrival. How close were the Ravens to earning a postseason berth last year? They were tied 17-17 near the end of the third quarter in the season-ending loss at Cincinnati, needing only that victory to clinch their sixth-straight playoff berth. In a season filled with close contests, the 2013 Ravens played an NFL-high nine games decided by 3 points or less, producing a 5-4 record in those games.

• Impressively, the Ravens, Colts, Patriots and Packers are the only teams to earn a playoff berth in five of the previous six seasons, with Baltimore making six postseason appearances in the past eight years.

• Following Thursday's preseason game, the Ravens will practice against the 49ers at M&T Bank Stadium on Friday, Aug. 8. The practice, which is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m., is free and open to the public. Baltimore and San Francisco will hold four total joint practices (Aug. 8-11) after their preseason contest. The three sessions following the Friday stadium practice will take place at the Under Armour Performance Center in Owings Mills.

• The remainder of Baltimore's preseason schedule includes an Aug. 16 game at Dallas, a "Beltway Battle" matchup vs. the Redskins in Charm City on Aug. 23, followed by a finale at New Orleans on Aug. 28.

### HARBS SAYS

"We're looking forward to playing the 49ers. They're such a good team. They do some things that we really need to fend off, that we need to see. They put a lot of pressure on the quarterback. They're just a big, stout team, so that's going to be good for us to play a quality team like this early. Obviously, they're pretty well coached. ... Every day, during camp practices, we are working towards being precise, being in sync and being good. We will have to be good early [in the regular season]. We have plenty of work to do."

### INJURY REPORT

Fourth-round draft pick **DE Brent Urban** sustained a torn ACL in practice on July 30. Veteran **CB Aaron Ross**, who tore an Achilles tendon while taking his conditioning test prior to the start of training camp, has been placed on Injured Reserve. **DT Terrence Cody** is on the Physically Unable to Perform list while recovering from offseason hip surgery.

### NOTE THE QUOTE

#### NEW OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR GARY KUBIAK ON JOINING THE RAVENS

"Guys want to be here. The way they run things, the professional way that the Ravens do things, the way **John [Harbaugh]** has his practices set up and treats these guys like men – they respond to it. I've always known from the outside looking in how tough this football team was and how hard they work and how hard they play. I'm proud to be a part of it now. I love the way we go about our business each and every day, and for me as a coach, that's what you want to be a part of."

### RAVENS UNDER HARBAUGH

**John Harbaugh** has guided the Ravens to 62 regular season wins since 2008, ranking third most in the NFL (Baltimore is 62-34). Including playoffs (9-4), the Ravens are 71-38 under Harbaugh, posting the NFL's second-most total wins since his Baltimore arrival, while also advancing to three AFC Championship games and winning Super Bowl XLVII.

## SPOTLIGHT: C.J. MOSLEY

**What player did you look up to most as a kid?** "Ray Lewis, mainly for the way he played the game. Every time you saw him, it always started with his intensity and speeches."

**What's the best part about being an inside linebacker?** "For me, it's the second switch – that second personality that I can bring to the football field. I've told people before about how I'm like two different people – on the field and off the field. Off the field, I'm just a laid back guy watching cartoons enjoying myself. But on the field, I'm a whole other person. I bring out that mentality where I can just be a beast and go out and cause a rampage on everything."

**What is your relationship like with fellow Alabama alum Ozzie Newsome?** "The first couple of times I met him, he always talked about me getting more talkative and to stop being so quiet. I pretty much gave him the same speech every time, saying: 'I'll talk on the field.' The Alabama tradition runs deep, and that proves a lot."

**What sports do you follow closest outside of football?** "I followed baseball a lot when I played, but since I stopped playing, I haven't followed as much. I am a White Sox fan, but I'd say the closest sport I follow is basketball. I'm a big Kobe Bryant and Lakers fan."

**Will your parents be attending many Ravens games this season?** "When they can, because my brother [Jamey] is a freshman at Alabama, and they have to work out the schedules to make it to both our games."

**What's it like having your brother follow your footsteps at Alabama?** "It's been great. It's been a great experience for him. He showed me yesterday on SnapChat his weight program, and he's already benching 320 pounds. That was way more than I was doing my freshman year, and I'm proud of him. He's playing outside linebacker now. He's tall, but he's just young. I'm excited and hope I get to catch a game this year."

“Baltimore is a playoff team. Despite having just missed the postseason for the first time in his six years at the helm, John Harbaugh is an excellent coach. In fact, I see Harbaugh winning his third division championship. Flacco isn’t feeling the heat like last year – when he signed a nine-figure contract, fresh off a Super Bowl triumph – and should enjoy a solid campaign. I believe in this organization; it’s fantastic, top to bottom. This defense should not only be better than last year’s unit, but better than the group from two years ago that raised the Lombardi Trophy.”

**General manager and executive vice president Ozzie Newsome on head coach John Harbaugh’s attitude:**

“Even when we won the Super Bowl a year ago, his evaluations centered on getting better. Not making the playoffs hurt us all. John didn’t complain about it. His attitude right away was ‘How do we get better and make sure this doesn’t happen again?’”

**Head coach John Harbaugh on what he sees in his team heading into training camp:**

“I sense a highly motivated team. It’s time to put your money where your mouth is, in a sense. Let’s go to work, let’s do something about it. That’s my mindset, and that’s how we’re going to approach it.”

**G Marshal Yanda on how head coach John Harbaugh runs practice:**

“You understand that we’re going to work harder than a lot of teams, and that’s just been the Raven way, and that’s been John’s way. So definitely, with new guys coming in, we just tell them this is the way it’s going to be, and we’re going to work hard, and we’re going to be more conditioned than most teams just by the amount of plays we run. That’s the way we’ve always done it.”

**ProFootballTalk.com’s Mike Florio on the Ravens’ 2014 outlook:**

“These are the Ravens, guided by a superb front office and excellent coaching staff. With some important additions, especially on offense, they’ll be poised to get back to the postseason. When they do, the Ravens will have the physicality to succeed against the best the NFC has to offer.”

**ESPN.com’s Jamison Hensley on the Ravens’ impact players on offense and their 2014 outlook:**

“I do see Dennis Pitta making a big impact. It’s no secret that Gary Kubiak’s offense is very tight end friendly. I believe the Ravens’ leader in catches this season will be Pitta or Steve Smith. As far as running the ball, the Ravens are quietly optimistic about their offensive line. Coach John Harbaugh loves the left side of Eugene Monroe and Kelechi Osemele. Jeremy Zuttah is an upgrade at center. There will be more running lanes for Ray Rice and Bernard Pierce this year. It all starts up front.”

**WR Torrey Smith on offensive coordinator Gary Kubiak:**

“I love him; he’s great. I think that he’s the perfect guy for what we need, and the way he is out there, he’s a great leader for us, and it’s easy to buy into what he’s preaching. He’s a great communicator as well, and he’s a guy you want to play for.”

**ESPN analyst Ron Jaworski on Joe Flacco’s level of talent:**

“He’s showed me something that I think is very important for longevity in the NFL. That’s a toughness that you have to have, to hang in the pocket with bodies flying around you. He played the end of the season severely injured. I’m not sure many guys would have played and led their team, guided their team under the circumstances Joe Flacco played in. Joe is a very talented player.”

**Sports Illustrated’s Don Banks on how WR Steve Smith, Sr. fits with his new team in Baltimore:**

“Smith has never lacked for intensity or focus and a willingness to speak his mind, and those qualities have already endeared him to Ravens head coach John Harbaugh and his new Baltimore teammates. Long considered one of the NFL’s ultimate competitors, Smith has fit hand in glove into the Ravens’ organizational mindset. Harbaugh has admired Smith’s game as far as back when he came out of the University of Utah as Carolina’s third-round pick in 2001, and he’s almost giddy at finally getting Smith in a Ravens uniform.”

**TE Dennis Pitta on the value of having newly-acquired TE Owen Daniels on the Ravens:**

“Owen has been a huge complement to what we’re doing here, and he’s, No. 1, a great football player. He’s had a lot of success in this league and continues to make plays out there. He’s been critical for me to be able to learn from. He’s been in this offense, I think eight or nine years, and has done a great job at it. So, I’m able to bounce questions off him, see how he runs certain routes and how he does things. It helps me become better.”

**CSNBaltimore.com’s Clifton Brown on the benefits of LBs C.J. Mosley and Daryl Smith playing together:**

“Mosley will benefit from being mentored by Smith. It wasn’t just Mosley’s talent that convinced the Ravens to draft him at No. 17. It was also his maturity. The Ravens needed more quickness defensively, and they think Mosley can be a sideline-to-sideline pursuer in the mold of Ray Lewis. There’s only one Lewis, but putting Mosley next to Smith should make the Ravens stronger against the run.”

**Special teams coordinator/associate head coach Jerry Rosburg on K Justin Tucker’s work ethic:**

“I think the thing we all recognize is that when you’re a professional, the journey never stops. You don’t ever arrive. You’re continuing to try to improve all aspects of your game. Justin has been doing that.”

## PRESEASON QUICK HITS

# HARBAUGH / GAME CONNECTIONS

## HARBAUGH CONNECTIONS

- San Francisco 49ers head coach **Jim Harbaugh's** connection to the Ravens is substantial. Jim is the younger brother of Ravens head coach **John Harbaugh**, and the Harbaughs are the first pair of brothers to be NFL head coaches. John and Jim are the sons of highly-respected college coach **Jack Harbaugh**, who spent 43 years as a coach in the high school and college ranks.
- John began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Western Michigan (1984-86), where Jack was the head coach (1982-86). After the 1986 season, Jack moved on to become an assistant at the University of Pittsburgh, where John followed and became the team's TEs coach. After one season coaching together at Pitt, John moved on to Morehead State to become the team's DBs/special teams/strength and conditioning coach.
- Jim began his coaching career while he was still an NFL quarterback. Jim served as an unpaid assistant coach at Western Kentucky from 1994-2001 under Jack, who was the head coach. Following a 14-year NFL career (1987-2000), Jim spent two seasons as an offensive assistant with the Raiders from 2002-03 before becoming the head coach at the University of San Diego in 2004. At USD, Jack served as the RBs coach under Jim from 2004-06. Jack also served as the RBs coach at Stanford in 2009 for the Sun Bowl.
- Jim was a QB for the Ravens in 1998, playing in 14 games (12 starts) and throwing for 1,839 yards and 12 TDs.
- Ravens offensive quality control coach **Jay Harbaugh** is the son of Jim. Jay began working for his uncle, John, during the Ravens' Super Bowl-winning season in 2012.
- Ravens defensive quality control/linebackers assistant **Matt Weiss** has worked under both of the Harbaugh brothers. First, Weiss worked under Jim as a graduate assistant at Stanford from 2005-07 and was promoted to defensive and specials teams assistant coach in 2008. Following the 2008 season, Weiss was hired by John and the Ravens as the head coach's assistant and eventually promoted to his current role in 2012.
- 49ers defensive coordinator **Vic Fangio** also worked under both Harbaughs. Fangio served under John as the Ravens' special assistant to the head coach/LBs coach from 2008-09, before leaving to become the defensive coordinator under Jim at Stanford in 2010. Fangio joined Jim in San Francisco in 2011.
- Ravens wide receivers coach **Bobby Engram** first entered the coaching ranks in 2011 as an offensive assistant under Jim and the 49ers. After one season with the Niners, Engram became the WRs coach at the University of Pittsburgh from 2012-13. In 2014, Engram was hired by John to coach Baltimore's receiving corps.

### Pro Connections

- Ravens offensive coordinator **Gary Kubiak's** NFL coaching career began in 1994 as QBs coach of the San Francisco 49ers, where he helped guide Hall of Fame QB Steve Young to his best pro season. Young, who posted a career-high 70.3 completion percentage, 35 passing TDs, 3,969 passing yards and a then-NFL record 112.8 passer rating, earned NFL MVP honors for the second time in his career en route to a victory in Super Bowl XXIX.
- Ravens TEs coach **Brian Pariani** was a scouting assistant (1990) and offensive coaches assistant (1991-94) for the 49ers.
- 49ers TEs coach **Eric Mangini** was Baltimore's offensive quality control/assistant coach in 1996 (the franchise's inaugural season).
- 49ers offensive coordinator **Greg Roman** was the assistant offensive line coach for the Ravens from 2006-07. Following the 2007 season, Roman served various roles in the offensive coaching staff at Stanford from 2009-10.
- 49ers **WR Anquan Boldin** played for the Ravens from 2010-12, totaling 186 receptions for 2,645 yards and 14 TDs over that three-year period. Boldin was a key member of the Ravens' 34-31 Super Bowl XLVII victory over San Francisco, leading the team with 104 yards and 1 TD on 6 catches.
- 49ers **WR David Reed** was selected by the Ravens in the fifth round (156th overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft. Reed, who was primarily a return specialist in Baltimore, spent three seasons with the Ravens (2010-12), posting a 103-yard KOR-TD in 2010.

### College Connections

- 49ers **TE Vernon Davis** played at the University of Maryland from 2003-05, recording 93 receptions for 1,371 yards and 9 TDs. As a junior, Davis was a consensus first-team All-American and All-ACC selection, in addition to being a finalist for the Mackey Award, given to the nation's top tight end.
- Ravens **LB C.J. Mosley** and **OLB Courtney Upshaw** and 49ers **DT Quinton Dial** were all members of Alabama's 2012 BCS National Championship team. Mosley and Dial also went on to win the National Championship together in 2013 with the Crimson Tide.
- Five players from these teams played at the University of Virginia: Ravens **DE Chris Canty** (2001-04), **T Eugene Monroe** (2006-09) and **DE Brent Urban** (2009-13) and 49ers **LB Ahmad Brooks** (2003-04) and **CB Chris Cook** (2005-06).

### California/Maryland/High School Connections

- Maryland natives playing for the 49ers include: **LB NaVorro Bowman** (Forestville) and **TE Vernon Davis** (Washington, D.C.).

- Ravens **CB Asa Jackson** and 49ers **TE Asante Cleveland** both attended Christian Brothers (Sacramento, CA) HS. Jackson and Cleveland also played on the basketball team together.
- Ravens **S Omar Brown** and 49ers **WR Bruce Ellington** attended Berkley (Moncks Corner, SC) HS. In July 2014, the duo returned to their hometown to host the first annual Ellington Elite Football Camp for children.

**John Harbaugh** has led Baltimore to a playoff berth in five (2008-12) of his first six full seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl championship. Under his guidance, the Ravens have also secured an appearance in three AFC Championship games (2008, 2011 and 2012).

## RAVENS' TWO-STRAIGHT TOP 5'S

In 2013, senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin of *The Dallas Morning News* ranked the Ravens' special teams unit No. 5 in the league in his annual comprehensive ratings system that is based on 22 categories, assigning points according to each standing — 1 for best, 32 for worst. In 2012, Gosselin ranked the Ravens' unit No. 2 in the NFL, just behind the Vikings, who finished first.

## SPECIAL FORCES



Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg**, a 36-year coaching veteran, has guided a strong special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008.

- In 2013, Pro Bowl K **Justin Tucker** set franchise records in FGs made (38) and FGs attempted (41). Going 38-of-41 on FGAs, Tucker produced a franchise-record 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL), while his 6 FGs of 50+ yards tied (several players) for the NFL's most. Tucker kicked an impressive 3 game-winning FGs on the season, including a 61-yarder at Detroit.

- Additionally, in 2013, the Ravens' kickoff return unit averaged 26.4 yards per return, ranking second in the NFL. Baltimore's punt return unit averaged 14.2 yards per return, good for the NFL's third-best mark. The Ravens posted an NFL-high 20 punt returns of 20+ yards.

- In 2012's Super Bowl-winning season, the Ravens' special teams units excelled. Led by Pro Bowl **RS Jacoby Jones**, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in kickoff return average (27.3), also setting a team record. Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR) and averaged an NFL-best 30.7 yards per kickoff return. Jones also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in Super Bowl history with his 108-yard KOR-TD.

- Prior to Baltimore, Rosburg built a successful NFL special teams resume both with the Browns (2001-06) and Falcons (2007). Under his leadership, Cleveland's special teams units were consistently ranked among the NFL's best. Over a five-year span (2002-06), the Browns' special teams were ranked as the top NFL unit in Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive special teams report.

- Four Ravens players have earned Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012) and K Justin Tucker (2013).

- Dating back to 2011, Baltimore has produced 6 total kick return TDs (3 PR & 3 KOR), tying (Den., Min. & Ten.) for the NFL's most.

## A STRONG RETURN

Dating back to 2008 when **Jerry Rosburg** became the Ravens' special teams coordinator, Baltimore has produced the NFL's No. 1 kickoff return average (25.0) and fourth-most KOR-TDs (5).

## THE KUBIAK ATTACK



**Gary Kubiak**, a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent the past eight seasons (2006-13) as head coach of the Houston Texans, was hired as the Ravens' offensive coordinator on Jan. 27. Under his guidance, Houston earned back-to-back AFC South crowns from 2011-12 and two playoff berths. Kubiak owns a Texans' franchise-record 63 total wins, posting a 63-66 overall mark (61-64 regular season, 2-2 postseason).

- Prior to his time with the Texans, Kubiak spent 11 seasons (1995-2005) as the Denver Broncos' offensive coordinator, also coaching the quarterbacks during his first eight seasons. Under his guidance, Denver's offense reached new heights behind the likes of QB John Elway, TE Shannon Sharpe and RB Terrell Davis, with the team earning seven postseason trips and back-to-back Super Bowl titles (1997-98) during that span. As Denver's offensive coordinator, the Broncos averaged NFL bests in yards per game (365.0) and points per game (25.2) from 1995-2005.

## TEXANS SUCCESS

Under **Gary Kubiak**, the Texans earned their Top 6 all-time offensive outputs in scoring, total offense and passing yards from 2007-12. During this time, the Texans also boasted the franchise's Top 3 rushing outputs, including the NFL's No. 2 ground attack in 2011 when they posted a franchise-record 153.0 yards per game. From 2008-12, Kubiak's offense was one of only two teams (Denver) to have its total offense, passing offense and rushing offense each rank in the Top 5 at least once during that span.

**Dean Pees**, an 11-year NFL-coaching veteran, was promoted to defensive coordinator on Jan. 27, 2012, after guiding the Ravens' LBs for two seasons. He is the sixth "D" coordinator in franchise history. Pees, who was New England's "D" coordinator from 2006-09, leads a Baltimore unit that in 2013 finished with the following NFL rankings: points (22.0 ppg, 12th), net yards (335.5 ypg, 12th), passing (230.1 ypg, 12th) and rushing (105.4 ypg, 11th).

Ozzie Newsome's legacy is unlike any the game has seen. Known throughout all of sports as a premier leader, Newsome is a Hall of Fame player, the architect of Baltimore's 2000 and 2012 Super Bowl championship teams and an elite personnel evaluator who became the NFL's first African American GM.

"Ozzie's credibility is what stands out the most," head coach **John Harbaugh** states. "And it's not just about what he has accomplished. To me, it's his commitment and focus while striving to do more."

The Flacco-to-Brown score finished a five-play, 80-yard drive that eclipsed all but four of the game's final 45 seconds.

Making 38 of 41 FGAs, Tucker produced a franchise-record 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL), while his 6 FGs of 50+ yards tied (several players) for the NFL's most. He kicked 3 game-winning FGs in 2013, including a 61-yarder at Detroit.

Tucker finished November 14-of-14 on FG attempts, going 3-for-3 from 50-plus-yards. He scored 49 points during the month. It marked Tucker's first-career Player of the Month Award.

## SMITH WAS SCINTILLATING

**WR Torrey Smith** excelled in 2013. With 6 receptions for 121 yards in Week 5 at Miami, Smith became the first Raven since Qadry Ismail in 1999 to post back-to-back 100-yard receiving games. (Ismail had three straight that year.)

- In Week 15 at Detroit, Smith (37) moved past Derrick Mason (35) to produce a franchise record in receptions of 25-or-more yards.
- Smith had 13 catches gaining 25-plus yards in 2013, just 1 shy of the franchise single-season record set by WR Michael Jackson (14) in 1996.
- Smith's 1,128 receiving yards in 2013 were the second most in Ravens single-season franchise history (Jackson – 1,201 in 1996).
- Smith, who produced a 17.4-yard receiving average in 2013, pulled in a 42-yard bomb in Week 16 vs. NE, marking his eighth catch of 40-or-more yards in 2013.

## TORREY'S COURAGEOUS NIGHT

**WR Torrey Smith** played in the 2012 Week 3 Sunday night victory over New England after his brother, 19-year-old Tevin Jones, passed away in a motorcycle accident that morning. Smith posted 6 catches for 127 yards and 2 TDs in the come-from-behind win, producing the third 100-yard game of his young career.

## SMITH BIG IN SUPER BOWL RUN

In the 2012 thrilling, double-overtime Divisional Playoff win at Denver (38-35 on 1/12/13), **WR Torrey Smith** caught 59-yard and 32-yard TD passes, helping mark the first game in NFL playoff history that a QB (**Joe Flacco**) threw 2 TDs of 59-plus yards (the other being to **WR Jacoby Jones** on a 70-yarder). In the 2012 postseason, Smith recorded a 21.2 yards-per-catch average, reeling in 11 passes for 233 yards.

## LONG BALL LOVE

**WR Torrey Smith** ranks first in Ravens franchise history in yards-per-catch average, posting a 17.2 mark over the three seasons in which he's caught 164 passes for 2,824 yards and 19 TDs. Dating back to his rookie campaign (2011), his 17.2 average ranks fifth in the NFL.

In 2011's Week 11 game vs. Cin., **WR Torrey Smith** set a Ravens' single-season and single-game record for receiving yards by a rookie, totaling 165 yards on 6 catches (27.5 avg.). In 2011, he had 50 catches for 841 yards and a Ravens' rookie-record 7 TDs.

Impressively, his 19 PD rank as a Ravens' record among LBs in a season (Ray Lewis, 13 in 2003) and tied for the NFL's fifth most in 2013. ## J. SMITH JAMMIN'



Ravens **CB Jimmy Smith**, the team's 2011 first-round draft pick (27th overall), was outstanding in 2013. Smith totaled 16 passes defended (third most on the team), adding 2 INTs, 2 forced fumbles and 58 total tackles in his first season as a regular starter. In the season's final 15 games, the Ravens allowed just 18 passing TDs, tied (New Orleans) for the NFL's sixth fewest. Baltimore also yielded 215.7 net passing yards a game during this span, the NFL's eighth-best mark.

## THE DOMINANT DT



One of the NFL's most disruptive forces, **DT Haloti Ngata** was named to his fifth Pro Bowl in 2013. Perhaps the NFL's most athletic defensive tackle, Ngata stops the run (497 career tackles), rushes the passer (23.5 career sacks) and can even drop into coverage (3 career INTs).

Baltimore has a history of strong run defense, and with Ngata's help since 2006, has been consistently sturdy on the ground.

## NEW TE TARGET



Two-time Pro Bowl **TE Owen Daniels**, who signed with the Ravens this offseason, owns the NFL's longest active streak of consecutive games (88) with a reception by a TE. Daniels, one of five AFC TEs to produce more than 50 catches in two of the past three seasons, boasts receptions in 97 of his 100 career contests as well. ## JUST FOR KICKS



In 2013, **K Justin Tucker** earned his first Pro Bowl honor by setting team records in FGs made (38) and FGs attempted (41), with both figures tying (Stephen Gostkowski) for the NFL's most. Tucker had a franchise-record 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL), while his 6 FGs of 50+ yards tied (several players) for the NFL's most.

- In addition to his Pro Bowl honor, Tucker was named Special Teams Player of the Month (November) and AFC Special Teams Player of the Week three times.
- Tucker made 33-straight FGs at one point during the 2013 season, ranking as the NFL's fourth-longest streak of all time.
- His 6 FGs made on 12/16 at Detroit set a team record and were a single-game NFL high in 2013. Against the Lions, he became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- and 60-yard range in a game.
- Tucker kicked 3 game-winning FGs in 2013, including a franchise-record 61-yarder at Detroit. (He now has 6-career game-winners.)
- He is now 24-of-26 during his career when the Ravens are losing a game, and he's 16-of-17 when Baltimore is down by 7 points or less. The Pro Bowler is 12-of-13 in the last 2 minutes of a game during his career, and he's 22-of-24 in the fourth quarter.
