JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens will play in their first-ever Pro Football Hall of Fame Game when they battle the Chicago Bears in Canton, OH, on Aug. 2, officially kicking off the 2018 NFL preseason. For this year's HOF induction, legendary Ravens LB Ray Lewis will achieve football immortality, while former Bears LB Brian Urlacher will also be enshrined into the prestigious hall.
- The Hall of Fame induction ceremony will take place on Saturday Aug. 4. Joining Lewis and Urlacher in the 2018 class are S Brian Dawkins, WR Randy Moss and WR Terrell Owens (all Modern Era enshrinees) and LB Robert Brazile and OL Jerry Kramer (Senior List selections) and Bobby Beathard (Contributor).
- In 2017, the Ravens won six of their last nine games, finishing second in the AFC North with a 9-7 record and falling one game short of earning a playoff berth (lost on tiebreaker to Buffalo.)
- All the Ravens needed to make the 2017 playoffs was a home win over Cincinnati in Week 17. However, Baltimore's hopes were dashed when the Bengals produced a 49-yard touchdown pass on fourthand-12 with just 44 seconds remaining to earn a hard-fought, 31-27 victory that closed out the season in heartbreaking fashion.
- John Harbaugh enters his 11th season at the Ravens' helm, leading the team to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 full Baltimore campaigns. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012), while in 2012, he guided the franchise to its second Super Bowl title.
- Including playoffs (10-5), the Ravens are 104-71 since Harbaugh's 2008 arrival, posting the NFL's fourth-most total victories. The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.

HARBS SAYS

INJURY UPDATE



RETURNING PLAYERS

- The Ravens return all **11 defensive starters** from 2017. This unit produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3). Baltimore allowed 18.9 points per game, sixth best in the NFL.
- The Ravens return **six offensive players** who started at least 12 games in 2017. Additionally, six-time Pro Bowl **G Marshal Yanda**, who missed 14 games with a broken ankle, returns from injury.

HOF SPOTLIGHT: RAY LEWIS



Below are excerpts from an exclusive interview with Hall of Fame linebacker Ray Lewis and safety Ed Reed, conducted in June by Ravens Productions. The feature will air in full on www.BaltimoreRavens.com on Aug. 2. Reporters are welcome to use these quotes and/or anything appearing in the upcoming video.

On playing with Ed Reed, a future Hall of Famer:

"I'm sitting there at home [in 2002], and [Ed Reed] gets drafted to Baltimore. The year before, I had just lost one of the greatest players I've ever played with — Rod Woodson. And I lose Rod, and Ozzie [Newsome] brings in Ed Reed. And I'm sitting there saying, 'Does he know, or do the people know, what just happened?!"

"When you go back in the history books, Baltimore, wherever you want to call out – [we were] the only players in NFL history to ever go back-to-back Defensive Players [of the Year] from the same team. In 2003 – I win it. In 2004, Ed Reed wins it. That's when I sat back – and I'll never forget it – I said, 'Bro, we've just done something that nobody has ever done in history.' If you fast forward, I just got inducted into the Hall of Fame. When [Reed texted] me, I said, 'You next.' The same back-to-back formula."

"I'll tell you this as a man, as a brother: I played with a lot of dudes that I called 'great teammates.' But I'm telling you, I was invincible when I had No. 20 behind me. What we did in Baltimore, the days we had, and when we started getting our swagger going, then the vision became clear: We need a ring together. I'll never forget, you said: 'Big bro, before you go, we gotta get a ring together.' I would love to see another duo more dominant than '52' and '20.'"

"Everyone that I've got [at the HOF induction] was an intricate part of my life. I don't know if I would have had as much fun, and if I would've kept being as passionate as I was, if I didn't play with [Reed] as a teammate. That's brother to brother. I watch film of us now, and I get teary-eyed, because no one knows the sacrifice. I died on that gridiron for '20."

On striving for greatness:

"Greatness is the loneliest thing that you'll ever do, but it's the most consistent thing that you have to commit to. If you don't ever do anything else, take a walk in [Baltimore] and see what type of love you feel from that city, because that's what greatness is."

"Greatness isn't one phase. Do you know how many times I failed? Keep on living!"

"I'm going to represent this gold jacket, because greatness doesn't stop, once you understand it's a lifestyle. We made it a lifestyle."

CAREER SNAPSHOT

Ray Lewis, a 2018 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee and 13-time Pro Bowler, was the Ravens' second-ever draft choice (26th overall in 1996). Lewis helped guide the Ravens to two Super Bowl titles during his career, capturing the Lombardi Trophy in 2000 and 2012.

Following the 2012 campaign, Lewis, who will be forever known as the greatest linebacker of his generation and one of the best defensive players in NFL history, retired after 17 seasons. Here is a brief look at his storied pro career:

- In 2000, Lewis led a defense that established a 16-game singleseason record for fewest points (165) and fewest rushing yards allowed (970), recorded four shutouts (one shy of the post-1970 merger record), and finished first league-wide in six key defensive categories
- Was the second player in NFL history to win both NFL Defensive Player of the Year and Super Bowl MVP awards (2000)...DT Harvey Martin of Dallas won Defensive Player of the Year in 1977 and was co-MVP of Super Bowl XXII with DT Randy White
- Is the only player in NFL history with at least 40 career sacks and 30 career INTs (41.5 sacks and 31 INTs)
- Posted a franchise-record 2,643 career tackles, including a single-season team-best 225 stops in 2003
- Led the Ravens in tackles in 14 of his 17 seasons, registering at least 150 stops 11 times
- Returned 3 of his 31 INTs for TDs
- Had a team-record and career-high 25 tackles at NYG (9/14/97)
- Posted seven career 20-tackle games
- Is second only to Jack Ham (53) in take-aways by a LB in NFL history with 50 total (31 INTs and 19 FRs)

PERENNIAL PRO BOWLER

LB Ray Lewis was invited to 13 Pro Bowls during his career, tying Hall of Famer Reggie White for the most by a defender in NFL history. Lewis played in 12 Pro Bowls, missing the 2006 Hawaiian classic due to a hand injury. Here are the defenders who have earned the most Pro Bowls during their careers.

PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER & RAVENS GM/EVP OZZIE NEWSOME:

"For 17 years, we could point to No. 52 and tell the other players: 'Follow his lead. Practice like Ray practices. Prepare like Ray prepares. Be a great teammate like him.' It was our privilege to have him as a Raven. We are all better for having him here. His play on gamedays speaks for itself. Even in that small group who have the honor of being a Hall of Famer, Ray stands out. When you talk about the great players of all time, no matter position, he is among the greatest of the great."

John Harbaugh (Ravens Head Coach): "Ray represented Ravens Football perfectly. He established what it means to Play Like a Raven, which has become a standard we believe in and our fans understand. It was an honor to coach Ray on the field and to maintain our friendship off it. I'm wishing Ray and his family many blessings during his Hall of Fame journey, as I know he walks in faith and will always remember that we walk together as Super Bowl champions."

Brian Billick (Former Ravens Head Coach): "What the fans saw of Ray Lewis on Sundays is what we saw every day, every meeting, every workout, every practice – that unabridged passion for the game and excellence. We congratulate him on what is truly a worthy Hall of Fame induction."

Steve Bisciotti (Ravens Owner): "Obviously, there is nobody more deserving. He made people around him better, which is the greatest compliment that you can give anybody in football, and he clearly was that guy."

Hall of Fame T Jonathan Ogden: "It's pretty clear Ray was the heart and soul of the Ravens for 17 years. If anyone is deserving of this honor, it's Ray Lewis. He is a guy we all looked to — both on offense and defense — to lead our team. He was definitely the catalyst for our 2000 Super Bowl team, and throughout the years, he helped define what it means to be a Raven. Few, if anyone, could do what Ray did — much like Lawrence Taylor, who had the ability to take over a game. Additionally, Ray's ability to inspire and positively impact everyone around him was a rarity.

"As the first two draft picks in Ravens history, Ray and I came in with the same mentality that we were determined to create something special. From the beginning, the bond we shared was incredibly special. That connection is even stronger now, as everything has come full circle, and we're able to stand side by side in the Hall of Fame."

Hall of Fame TE Shannon Sharpe: "Before we get to his play, Ray is the greatest leader in team sports history. No one is even close. His resume as a player speaks for itself, but I'll add this: He dominated in two eras of football. In the first half of his career, when the run game was the most prominent, he was a beast. Extraordinary. He singlehandedly shut down great backs like Jerome Bettis, Eddie George and Fred Taylor. When the passing game became the way teams regularly moved the ball, he was spectacular. Teams didn't run screens against him. Receivers became reluctant to come across his view, and his speed allowed him to take away shallow and deep parts of the middle of the field. I saw all of this as a teammate with him and playing against him. No inside linebacker in the history of the game has the resume of the man I call 'Suga.'"

Marvin Lewis (Former Ravens Defensive Coordinator): "Ray is the most driven, talented and smart player I have ever met. Each day he wanted to know what he could do to be the best and make the team better." Hall of Fame S Rod Woodson: "What needs to be said about a guy who was, by far, the best leader I witnessed in my 17 years of play? Not only a great leader to the whole team, but a mentor to teammates and players on other teams — and those playing other pro sports. (People would be amazed at the athletes being mentored by Ray today.) His singular focus to be the best player and teammate he could be separates him from other Hall of Famers. So unselfish. So selfless.

"The passion we all saw was real. He's relentless. It is who he is. His play was off the charts, a virtual tackling machine — and a playmaker. He caused fumbles, recovered fumbles, interceptions, tipped passes. He did it all for longer than anyone who played his spot in the middle. If possible, he got better with age. His attitude and effort remained the highest, but his knowledge increased with all his study. Even as a young player, he would call out the plays the offense was about to run. He could play so fast, and with such confidence, because he knew what was about to happen."

S Ed Reed: "I believe my big brother is one of the greatest football players to ever put on a uniform. Everything he displayed about the game – on the field and off the field – by being a leader and a constant professional truly set a great example for those around him. Honestly, I think he could still play."

Hall of Famer Mike Singletary (Former Ravens LB Coach): "It was my privilege to spend time with Ray and be awed by his play and leadership. As a witness from the sideline in practices and in games as his linebackers coach, I saw everything about him. As a player, he was ferocious. His ability to make every play, and the way he did it with his speed and power, I'll never forget that. He electrified his teammates in practice and games.

"His leadership was none like I've ever seen. His work was so thorough, his credibility allowed him to bring his teammates along with him to the highest levels. He took over games emotionally, creating intensity that was special and off the charts.

"I can't emphasize enough how his teammates followed him. He worked at his craft. Did he work harder than everybody else? I can't identify another like him. Hall of Famer? He's the best I've seen, and, if people thought I was good, I know that Ray was better."

Mike Nolan (Former Ravens Defensive Coordinator): "You could argue that Ray is the greatest defensive player in history. I was very fortunate to coach Lawrence Taylor. Since he was an outside linebacker, offenses could run away from him. The same with a great lineman like Reggie White. You couldn't run away from Ray. He played in the middle of the field. He could literally stop inside running games, sweeps and screen passes by himself. Then you add his dedication to the game: the film study, the lifting, the passion, the leadership. I grew up in the game and never saw or heard about anyone who did what Ray did."

2018 COACHING CHANGES

- The Ravens promoted **Don "Wink" Martindale** to defensive coordinator, **Mike Macdonald** to linebackers coach and **Sterling Lucas** to quality control defense. The moves came following the departure of former defensive coordinator Dean Pees, who originally retired following the season, but later decided to return to coaching as Tennessee's defensive coordinator.
- Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, **LB C.J. Mosley** has developed into one of the NFL's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls in his first four seasons.
- The Ravens also hired **James Urban** as their quarterbacks coach, while **Greg Roman** was promoted to assistant head coach. Urban spent the past seven years as the Bengals' wide receivers coach. Prior to that, he was the Philadelphia Eagles' quarterbacks coach in 2009 and 2010, when he helped direct Pro Bowl seasons for Donovan McNabb ('09) and Michael Vick ('10).
- Roman, who was hired by the Ravens in 2017 as the team's senior offensive assistant/tight ends coach, will continue his work coaching the TEs.

2018 SCHEDULING NOTES

- The Ravens will open and close their 2018 regular season schedule by playing home games at M&T Bank Stadium (Week 1 vs. the Buffalo Bills and Week 17 vs. the Cleveland Browns).
- Two of the Ravens' first four games this season will be nationally televised, with both of those primetime contests occurring on the road (including a Week 4 Sunday night game at Pittsburgh).
- The Week 4 primetime battle at Pittsburgh (9/30) begins a stretch when Baltimore will play four of five games on the road. (This includes three-consecutive away games from Weeks 4-6: at Pittsburgh, at Cleveland and at Tennessee.)
- Four of the Ravens' first six games will be played on the road, as will five of their first eight.
- The Ravens will not leave Baltimore in the month of November, with all three games being played at M&T Bank Stadium. (Baltimore's bye falls on Nov. 11, marking the second-straight year with a Week 10 bye.)
- Six of the Ravens' first nine games are against 2017 playoff teams. Starting in Week 4 at Pittsburgh, Baltimore embarks on a six-game stretch when the Ravens will face five 2017 postseason participants.
- The Ravens play five division opponents in the first 10 games.
- All three of Baltimore's divisional road games will be completed by Week 5. (This is the earliest the Ravens will have ever finished their AFC North Division road schedule, with the previous earliest occurring in Week 9 of 2014.)
- After playing five preseason games, including the final three in 11 days, Baltimore opens the regular season by playing two games in a five-day span, with the second on the road (at Cincinnati).

INTs by S Eric Weddle, who in 2017 tied (A.J. Bouye) for the NFL's third most. In his first two seasons (2016-17) as a Raven, he has 10 INTs, which rank No. 1 among all NFL safeties in that span.

NFL defenders, including Ravens second-year **OLB Matthew Judon**, who posted at least 50 tackles, 15 tackles for loss, 8 sacks and 2 forced fumbles in 2017. Judon joined Jadeveon Clowney, Chandler Jones, Cameron Jordan and Von Miller in the elite group.

NFL ranking of 2017 rookie CB Marlon Humphrey's defensive passer rating (49.6), among players who were targeted a minimum of 15 times. The first-round pick also snagged 2 INTs.

LB Ray Lewis - 2000 Super Bowl XXXV MVP

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.



THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only eight teams (NE 9; GB 8; Pit. 7; Atl., Bal., Cin., Ind. & Sea. 6) to earn at least six postseason berths in the last 10 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in each of those playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the third-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 10 seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first 10 years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 11TH NFL: 18TH

Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (202) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 90.2% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (202-of-224 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and inside the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB Bobby Rainey Jr. posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR Michael Campanaro registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens became the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's second-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high (tied) 4 in 2016.

A 23-year NFL coaching veteran, Mornhinweg, who joined Baltimore as QBs coach in 2015, is a former head coach of the Lions (2001-02). He has also served as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets (2013-14), Philadelphia Eagles (2004-12) and San Francisco 49ers (1997-2000).

FIVE PRO BOWLERS

• Throughout his NFL coaching career, five quarterbacks have earned Pro Bowl honors under Mornhinweg's direction: Michael Vick, Donovan McNabb, Steve Young, Jeff Garcia and Brett Favre.


DON "WINK" MARTINDALE & DEFENSIVE NOTES

"WINK" TO LEAD THE DEFENSE

On Jan. 9, 2018, the Ravens promoted **Don "Wink" Martindale** to defensive coordinator following the retirement of Dean Pees. Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, **LB C.J. Mosley** has become one of the league's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls.

The 2018 campaign will mark Martindale's 14th season coaching in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

"'Wink' has earned the promotion to defensive coordinator," **John Harbaugh** stated. "His aggressive mentality will serve to take our defense to new levels. He is obviously respected by players, many of whom have already benefited from his direct coaching at the linebacker position. He knows the ins and outs of what we have been about on defense and has been an important contributor to our success on that side of the ball. This is an exciting day for Wink and his family, and also one for the Ravens."



2017 DEFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- ✓ The Ravens produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3 – the most in a season since the 2003 Patriots).
- ✓ Baltimore allowed 18.9 points per game, which ranked No. 6 in the league. It marked the seventh time during the John Harbaugh Era (2008-17) the Ravens produced a Top 10 scoring "D."
- ✓ The Ravens' defense ranked 12th overall (325.1 ypg), producing the NFL's 10th-best pass defense (213.8 ypg).

SHUT 'EM DOWN

The Ravens have posted an NFL-high 13 shutouts since their 1996 inception, a mark that includes three opponent "blankings" this season. Baltimore is the fifth team – and first since 2003 (NE) – in the past 30 years to record at least three shutouts in a season.





In 2017, he connected on 64.1 percent of his passes for 3,141 yards, 18 TDs and 13 INTs.

"No disrespect to any of the guys I've played with, but it's nice not to have to explain why I do certain things or why I'm doing this in this coverage. From Day One, [Jefferson] already had a feel for how I play and how to work off me. ... It frees me up a lot more mentally. I don't have to tell him after each play why I did this or, before the snap, say, 'Let's do this.' He already knows. That is just light years ahead of most guys I've played with. 

In his 10th season (2015), **P Sam Koch** was finally named to his first Pro Bowl, as the standout punter's net average (42.9) ranked No. 2 in the NFL, while his gross average (46.7) was ninth. Koch also dominated the league in 2014, pro4ducing the No. 1 net (43.3) and No. 3 gross (47.4) averages.

NOTE THE QUOTE

ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

PERHAPS THE BEST YEAR EVER

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

- ✓ Since PATs were moved back in 2015, Tucker (95-of-95) is the only NFL kicker yet to miss.
- ✓ Tucker is a four-time AFC Special Teams Player of the Month, which ranks one more than legends S Ed Reed & K Matt Stover for the most POM awards in Ravens history. (Tucker has also earned seven AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.) "Tuck" earned his fourth POM award in Nov. 2017, going 8-for-8 on FGAs and 6-for-6 on PATs.
- ✓ Tucker's 6 FGs on 12/16/13 at Det. set a team record and a single-game NFL high in 2013. Against the Lions, he became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- & 60-yard range in a game.
- ✓ Tucker's 93.7 career FG% when kicking on grass (104-of-111) ranks as the NFL's best of all time.
- ✓ Tucker's 92.5 career FG% (98-of-106) in the second half/overtime ranks as the NFL's best second half/OT mark of all time.

RAVENS IN OUR COMMUNITY

RAVENS SIGNATURE PROJECT: KABOOM! PLAYGROUND BUILD

In June, the Baltimore Ravens partnered with the nonprofit KaBOOM! and the Housing Authority of Baltimore City to build a playground for the children and families of the Douglass Homes community. This is the fourth KaBOOM! playground the Ravens have built in Baltimore City, reinforcing their commitment to helping spread the KaBOOM! message of encouraging all children to enjoy a childhood full of active play. Over 200 volunteers, comprised of Ravens players and staff, built the playground in under six hours. Volunteer activities included assiting with painting of U.S. and world maps, assembling new picnic tables and bench seating, aiding in beautification and landscaping of the area and building the new playground. Before this playground, Douglass Homes did not have a designated area where youth could play, forcing families to travel to other parts of Baltimore to access playgrounds or recreational equipment. This project will help the children of this community continue their physical, creative, cognitive and social/emotional development.







UP2US SPORTS ANNOUNCEMENT

This past spring, the Baltimore Ravens launched a fiveyear partnership with Up2Us Sports, a national nonprofit dedicated to inspiring children to achieve their potential by providing them with coaches trained in positive youth development. This \$1.5 million investment will help expand the Up2Us Sports program throughout Baltimore from 2018-23, aiming to hire, train and support more than 200 coaches to become life skills mentors to youth living in low-income communities. With the help of the Ravens, Up2Us Sports hopes to train more than 2,000 youth coaches in Baltimore, utilizing the lessons learned in sports to address the physical and mental health risks associated with poverty and other socio-econoic issues. This Baltimore-based program aims to directly impact more than 18,000 area youth. Ravens president Dick Cass, along with OLB Matthew Judon, T Ronnie Stanley and DT Brandon Williams, attended the annoucement ceremony at Baltimore's Boys and Girls Club of Metropolitan Baltimore.



ELLICOTT CITY RELIEF

In 2016, Ellicott City was devestated by a horrible flood. Seeing a community in need the Ravens stepped up to help with relief efforts. Two years later, that same community was hit by another disasterous flood this past May. Honoring the promise previously made, the Ravens dedicated themselves to helping once again. On June 6, the Ravens surprised the Howard County Community Foundation with a \$10,000 donation at their Play Like A Rayen Clinic, Additionally, the team took a moment to recognize a fallen soldier and valued member of their community, Sgt. Eddison "Eddie" Hermond, a 39-year-old active Army National Guard member and Air Force vetern who tragically died in the recent flood trying to rescue a shop owner who was trapped. In honor of him, a moment of silence was held before the clinic began. Sgt. Hermond, a loyal Ravens fan, is survived by his mother, younger sister and teenage son. Ravens players RB Javorius Allen, RB Alex Collins, RB Mark Thompson and DT Zach Sieler participated in the presentation.
