- COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS -

- Played in 34 games (18 starts) over three years (2021-23) at Clemson, totaling 60 tackles (49 solo), 3 TFL, 1 sack, 3 INTs – including 2 picks returned for TDs – 2 FFs, 21 PD and 1 blocked FG
- Appeared in 10 games (seven starts) for a 9-4 Clemson squad in 2023, posting 29 tackles (23 solo), 1 sack, 2 INTs – including 1 pick-6 – a career-best 2 FFs and 6 PD, en route to *AP* first-team All-ACC honors...Allowed a 43.9% personal completion percentage when QBs targeted players he matched up against...Also allowed just 1 completion of at least 20 yards...Played an integral role on the nation's eighthbest total defense (287.8 ypg) – a unit that also ranked No. 4 in opponent completion percentage (52.9%) and No. 8 in passing yards allowed per game (173.2)
- Received honorable mention All-ACC recognition in 2022 after recording 29 tackles (25 solo), 2 TFL, 1 pick-6 and a career-best and team-high 13 PD, while adding 1 blocked FG, in 13 games (11 starts) for 11-3 conference champion Clemson...The Tigers' defense permitted 20.9 ppg (23rd in the nation)

2023: (CLEMSON – 10/7)

- Appeared in 10 games (seven starts) for a 9-4 Clemson squad, posting 29 tackles (23 solo), 1 sack, 2 INTs including 1 pick-6 a career-best 2 FFs and 6 PD, en route to *AP* first-team AII-ACC honors...Allowed a 43.9% personal completion percentage when QBs targeted players he matched up against...Played an integral role on the nation's eighth-best total defense (287.8 ypg) a unit that also ranked No. 4 in opponent completion percentage (52.9%) and No. 8 in passing yards allowed per game (173.2)
- Posted 6 solo tackles in the win at South Carolina, contributing on a defense that permitted 112 passing yards and a season-low 7 points
- Registered a season-high-tying 8 tackles (7 solo), 1 INT and 1 FF in the win vs. No. 20 North Carolina, earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week and Team Defensive Player of the Game honors...His INT of QB Drake Maye proved to be the game-sealing takeaway, while his FF came in a TDsaving effort in which he reached 22.1 MPH to chase down the ACC's leading rusher (RB Omarion Hampton) at the goal line...Matched up with fellow Ravens 2024 draft pick WR Devontez Walker
- Produced 8 tackles (4 solo), 1 PD and his first-career FF, a chase-down, goal-line punchout, at Miami (FL)...Contributed to a Clemson pass defense that permitted 151 yards through the air
- Registered 2 PD vs. No. 4 Florida State...Supported a run defense that permitted 22 yards on 20 attempts (1.1 avg.)
- Posted 1 tackle and a 46-yard pick-6 in the win vs. Florida Atlantic...Became the first Clemson player with a pick-6 in consecutive seasons since DB Rex Varn (against Maryland in 1977 & NC State in 1978)
- Tallied 2 solo tackles and his first-career sack in the win vs. Charleston Southern

2022: (CLEMSON - 13/11)

- Received honorable mention All-ACC recognition after recording 29 tackles (25 solo), 2 TFL, 1 pick-6 and a careerbest and team-high 13 PD, while adding 1 blocked FG, in 13 games played (11 starts) for 11-3 conference champion Clemson...The Tigers' defense permitted 20.9 ppg (23rd in the nation)...Led Clemson's secondary with 767 defensive snaps, while his 13 PD ranked amongst the most in singleseason program history
- Recorded 2 solo tackles, 2 PD and a career-long 98-yard pick-6 of QB Drake Maye, while adding 1 blocked FG, in the ACC Championship win at No. 24 North Carolina...It marked the first INT of his career and the longest play in ACC Championship history
- Notched 3 solo tackles and 2 TFL, marking his first-career multi-TFL performance, vs. South Carolina...Supported a run defense that permitted 55 yards on 31 attempts (1.8 avg.)
- Posted 1 solo tackle and 1 PD, contributing to a pass defense that permitted a season-low 68 yards and 9 completions on 18 attempts, in the win vs. Miami (FL)
- Registered a season-high 7 solo tackles, while adding 1 PD, in the win vs. Louisville
- Posted 2 solo tackles, contributing to a pass defense that permitted just 85 yards and 9 completions on 17 attempts, at Notre Dame
- Tallied 2 PD, marking his third-consecutive multi-PD performance, in the win at Florida State...Became the first Clemson player to register a three-plus-game streak with multiple PD since S K'Von Wallace in 2019

- Posted 3 tackles (2 solo) and 2 PD in the win vs. No. 10 North Carolina State...Supported a run defense that permitted 34 yards on 21 carries (1.6 avg.)
- Totaled 4 solo tackles and the game-winning PD in the OT win at No. 21 Wake Forest

2021: (CLEMSON - 11/0)

- Appeared in 11 games as a true freshman, posting 2 tackles and 2 PD
- Made his first-career tackle in the win vs. South Carolina State...Contributed to a Clemson pass defense that permitted 132 yards through the air on a season-low 37.0% completion percentage (10-of-27)

- HIGH SCHOOL -

- Graduated from Westlake (Atlanta, GA) HS in 2021 after spending his first three years (2017-19) at Henry W. Grady (Atlanta, GA) HS...Starred on offense and defense at both programs
- Transferred to Westlake HS in 2020, helping lead the team to an 11-2 record and the regional title as a star CB and WR...Earned first-team All-State on defense and was selected for the 2021 All-American Bowl
- As a junior at Grady HS (2019), recorded 30 receptions for 814 yards (27.1 average) and 9 TDs, adding 25 tackles and 3 INTs, including 1 pick-6

- Hosted a youth football clinic for 150 kids around his hometown at Pittman Park in Atlanta, GA (2024)
- Visited the St. Paul's School for an afternoon of fellowship and fun with Next One Up...Rookies and students were divided into three groups, rotating between kickball, silent charades and "anything but football" conversations (2024)
- Participated in the organization-wide Signature Build Day at Samuel Coleridge-Taylor Elementary School...Throughout the day, close to 200 volunteers made up of current and former Ravens players, staff and executives refurbished the school's gymnasium, classrooms, teachers' lounges and hallways...Additionally, volunteers renovated the playground and outdoor courtyard, planted trees and painted outdoor murals to enhance landscaping and enrich the school community (2024)
