— CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- Has appeared in 118 games (95 starts), posting 340 receptions for 4,246 yards (12.5 avg.) and 31 TDs over his eight-year career with the Patriots (2021-22) Raiders (2020) and Eagles (2015-19)
- With the Raiders in 2020, posted the second-highest yards-per-reception average (18.7 yards) and second-most TD receptions of 20+ yards (6) by any NFL player
- Totaled the second-most receptions (165), third-most receiving yards (1,867) and third-most receiving TDs (15) by an Eagles' player from 2017-19
- Recorded 84 yards on a team-high 9 receptions to help the Eagles claim their first Super Bowl (LII) victory in franchise history vs. NE (2/4/18)...Caught 3 consecutive passes for 3 first downs (10, 18, 10 yards) during the fourth-quarter drive that resulted in the game-winning TD...Tied (WR Terrell Owens and RB Keith Byars – twice) for the second-most receptions in Eagles playoff history, trailing only TE Brent Celek's 10 receptions at Ari (1/18/09)
- Tied for the eighth-most receiving TDs (8) by any NFL player in 2017, which included a streak of three consecutive games with at least 1 TD from Weeks 5-7 (vs. Ari, at Car. and vs. Was.)

- Won a little league Super Bowl at Raymond James Stadium, home of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers
- Growing up, enjoyed watching NFL players RB LaDainian Tomlinson, QB Brett Favre, WR Reggie Wayne, WR Larry Fitzgerald and WR Santana Moss
- Ravens quarterbacks coach Tee Martin was Agholor's wide receivers coach at USC
- Enjoys doing Pilates and incorporates it into his workout regiment
- Started Our Kids, Our Responsibility, a foundation that upholds the idea that it takes a village to raise children
- Lived with his Godmother, Leslie Berlin, in high school, whom he considers a mentor

2022: (NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS – 16/7)

- Appeared in all 16 games (seven starts), collecting 362 yards and 2 receiving TDs on 31 receptions (11.7 avg.)
- Totaled 65 yards on 6 receptions (10.8 avg.), including a 34-yard TD reception on the opening drive, at Min. (11/24)...Was one of five NE players to record at least 60 receiving yards (joining TE Hunter Henry, WR Jakobi Meyers, WR DeVante Parker and RB Rhamondre Stevenson), marking the most players on one team to reach that figure in single contest all season...The five players with at least 60 receiving yards also set a Patriots record since data became available in 2000
- Registered a team-high 46 receiving yards on 3 receptions (15.3 avg.) at GB (10/2)...Posted a 27-yard grab on the opening drive and a 21-yard catch on a fourth-quarter TD drive
- Posted 6 receptions for a team-high 110 yards, including a season-long 44-yard TD catch, in the 17-14 win at Pit. (9/18)...This was his first 100-yard receiving output as a Patriot and the seventh of his career

2021: (NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS – 15/13, 1/1)

- Appeared in 15 games (13 starts) in his first season in New England, posting 37 receptions for 473 receiving yards (12.8 avg.) and 3 TDs...Tied WR Kendrick Bourne for the team lead in receptions of 25-plus yards (6)
- Posted 1 catch for 18 yards as a starter in the Wild Card Playoff at Buf. (1/15/22)
- Registered 40 receiving yards on 5 receptions (8.0 avg.), including a 19-yard score, in the 25-0 shutout win at Atl. (11/18)
- Posted 60 yards on 3 receptions (20.0 avg.) in the 27-24 victory at LAC (10/31)...His season-long 44-yard catch on the team's opening drive created a red zone opportunity that led to a TD

- Notched 2 receptions for 51 yards, including a 26-yard gain and a 25-yard TD, in the 54-13 victory vs. NYJ (10/24)...His opening-drive TD grab was thrown by WR Kendrick Bourne on a double-pass trick play
- Tallied 3 receptions for 55 yards, including a 30-yarder that brought the Patriots into red zone territory, at TB (10/3)
- Registered a team-high 72 receiving yards on 5 receptions (14.4 avg.), including a 7-yard TD catch from QB Mac Jones, in the season opener vs. Miami (9/12)...It marked his first TD reception as a Patriot and the first-career TD pass thrown by Jones

2020: (LAS VEGAS RAIDERS – 16/13)

- Played in all 16 games (13 starts), totaling 48 receptions and single-season career highs in receiving yards (896) and receiving TDs (8, tied)...Posted the second-highest yards-per-reception average (18.7 yards) and second-most TD receptions of 20+ yards (6) by any NFL player...Recorded his first season with multiple 100-yard performances (3), while finishing as the only Raider with multiple 50-yard receptions (3)...Contributed to a Raiders passing attack that averaged the fifth-most yards per reception (11.9) and ranked No. 7 in yards after the catch per reception (5.6)
- Totaled a career-high 155 receiving yards on 5 receptions (31.0 avg.), including a career-long 85-yard TD reception, vs. Miami (12/26)...His TD also marked the NFL season's second-longest reception (WR Jerry Jeudy – 92 yards)
- Notched 5 receptions for a team-high 100 yards and 1 TD vs. Ind. (12/13)
- Posted a season-high 6 receptions for 88 yards (14.7 avg.) and 1 TD vs. KC (11/22)
- Recorded the fourth 100-yard receiving game of his career and a TD for the third-consecutive game, which tied for the longest streak of his career, vs. TB (10/25)...His 105 receiving yards on 5 catches paced the team...Collected a 28-yard catch and 20-yard TD reception on the team's opening drive
- Scored a 59-yard TD in the 40-32 victory at KC (10/11), ending the Chiefs' four-game winning streak to begin the season...The Raiders scored 2 TDs of at least 50 yards in a game for the first time since the 1996 season
- Caught the 7-yard TD pass from QB Derek Carr that helped Carr set the record for most TD passes in a Raiders career (151) vs. Buf. (10/4)...Finished with 4 catches for 44 yards and 1 TD
- Caught a 23-yard TD in the 34-30 win at Car. (9/13)...The scoring grab was his first reception as a Raider and the franchise's first TD since relocating to Las Vegas

2019: (PHILADELPHIA EAGLES – 11/10, 0/0)

- Appeared in 11 games (10 starts), totaling 363 receiving yards and 3 receiving TDs on 39 catches (9.3 avg.) in his last season with Philadelphia...Contributed on an offense that ranked No. 3 in red zone efficiency (66.7%) and No. 4 in both first downs per game (22.1) and third-down conversion percentage (45.4%)

- Was inactive for five of the final six games of the regular season and the Wild Card Playoff vs. Sea. (1/5/20)
- Matched his single-game career high with 8 receptions and 2 TDs, totaling 50 receiving yards (6.3 avg.), vs. Det. (9/22)...Became the fifth player in Eagles history to log at least 8 receptions and 1 TD in back-to-back games (Hall of Famer Terrell Owens – 2005, Irving Fryar – 1996, Mike Quick – 1985 and Bud Grant – 1952)
- Registered 8 receptions for a team- and season-high 107 yards (13.4 avg.) and 1 TD at Atl. (9/15), the third 100-yard receiving game of his career...His season-long 43-yard fourth-down reception brought Philly into the red zone, keeping alive its late-game comeback attempt

2018: (PHILADELPHIA EAGLES – 16/16, 2/2)

- Started all 16 regular season games for the first time in his career, tallying 736 yards and 4 TDs on 64 receptions (11.5 avg.) for an Eagles' passing attack that ranked No. 7 (267.2 ypg)...Led the team with 8 receptions of 25-plus yards and 4 receptions of 50-plus yards...Totaled 38 yards on 4 receptions (9.5 avg.) and 12 yards on 1 carry in his two postseason starts
- Posted the first multi-score game of his career after recording 2 TDs and 40 yards on 5 receptions (8.0 avg.) in the regular season finale, a 24-0 shutout victory at Was. (12/30)...Collected 5-of-6 targets, helping Philadelphia register a season-high 85.3% (29-of-34) receptions-to-targets ratio
- Recorded a season-high 116 yards on 5 receptions (23.2 avg.), including an 83-yard TD reception, in a 32-20 win vs. Hou. (12/23)...His 83-yard score was the then-longest of his career and the longest receiving TD by an Eagle since WR DeSean Jackson caught a 91-yard TD at Dal. (12/12/10)
- Registered 5 receptions for 83 yards, including a game-long 51-yard grab, vs. Dal. (11/11)
- Led the team with 91 yards on 3 receptions (30.3 avg.), including a game-long 58-yard reception that led to an Eagles red zone TD on the very next play, in the 34-13 win vs. NYG (10/11)...Also registered a 32-yard grab, notching his first outing of the season with multiple 25-yard gains
- Matched his single-game career high with 8 receptions for 88 yards (11.1 avg.) and 1 TD at TB (9/16)...Became the first player in Eagles history to record at least 8 receptions in each of the team's first two games of a season
- Completed his first-career pass attempt for 15 yards and also posted a 16-yard rush in the season opener, an 18-12 win vs. Atl. (9/6)...By adding 33 receiving yards on 8 receptions, became the second Eagles player (RB Keith Byars – 12/23/90 vs. Dal.) since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record at least 15 yards passing, rushing and receiving in a single game

2017: (PHILADELPHIA EAGLES – 16/10, 3/3)

- Played in all 16 regular season games (10 starts), finishing with 768 yards and 8 TDs on 62 receptions (12.4 avg.) for a Philadelphia offense that ranked first in red zone TD percentage (65.5%), third in points scored per game (28.6) and fourth in first downs per game (21.1), helping the Eagles capture a 13-3 record and its first-ever Super Bowl (LII) Championship...Led the team with nine 20-plus yard receptions, including two 50-plus yard TDs...Joined TE Zach Ertz & WR Alshon Jeffery to form the sixth single-team triad in NFL history and the first in Eagles history to each tally at least 50 receptions, 700 receiving yards and 8 receiving TDs in the same season...Appeared in the three postseason games during the Eagles' Super Bowl run, recording 167 yards on 15 receptions (11.1 avg.)
- Recorded 84 yards on a team-high 9 receptions to help the Eagles claim their first Super Bowl (LII) victory in franchise history vs. NE (2/4/18)...Caught 3 consecutive passes for 3 first downs (10, 18, 10 yards) during the fourth-quarter drive that resulted in the game-winning TD...Tied (WR Terrell Owens and RB Keith Byars – twice) for the second-most receptions in Eagles playoff history, trailing only TE Brent Celek's 10 receptions at Ari (1/18/09)
- Collected 3 receptions for 59 yards in the 38-7 NFC Championship victory vs. Min. (1/21/18), helping the Eagles advance to their third Super Bowl in franchise history...Philadelphia's 31-point margin of victory marked its most lopsided in playoff history (since tied)
- Caught 3 passes for 24 yards (8.0 avg.) and made his postseason debut in a 15-10 Wild Card Playoff victory vs. Atl. (1/13/18)
- Tallied 64 yards and 1 TD on 8 receptions (8.0 avg.) in the 43-35 win at LAR (12/10)
- Posted a team-high 7 receptions for 59 yards and 1 TD in the 34-29 win at NYG (12/17)
- Registered a team-high 8 receptions for 64 yards in the 43-35 win at LAR (12/10), helping the Eagles produce their most total yards (455) and first downs (29) of the season...The Eagles' 43 points scored also marked their most in a road contest since 2013 (49 – 11/3/13 at Oak.)
- Posted a team-high and season-best 141 yards and 1 TD on 7 receptions (20.1 avg.) at Sea. (12/3), helping Philadelphia record a season-high 327 passing yards...Produced a career-high 3 receptions of 25-plus yards...Became the first Eagle to produce at least 140 receiving yards and 1 TD in a single game since WR Jordan Matthews vs. Ari. (12/20/15)
- Tallied a 15-yard TD reception, finishing with 3 catches for 32 yards and a score, in the 31-3 win vs. Chi. (11/26)
- Collected 4 receptions for 45 yards and 1 TD in the 34-24 win vs. Was. (10/23), marking a career-long three game streak of TD performances (since tied)
- Posted 4 receptions for 55 yards and 1 TD – a 24-yarder – in the 28-23 win at Car. (10/12)...Recorded a TD in back-to-back games for the first time in his career

- Tallied 4 receptions for a team-high 93 yards and 1 TD in the 34-7 win vs. Ari. (10/8)...His 72-yard TD marked the then-longest of his career and the longest by an Eagle all season...Passed the line to gain on two third-and-long attempts, helping Philadelphia convert a season-high 64.3% (9-of-14) of third-down tries
- Collected a 9-yard TD reception at KC (9/17), marking his second score in as many weeks
- Recorded 6 receptions for 86 yards and 1 TD – a then-career-long 58-yarder on the team's first possession – in the 30-17 season-opening win at Was. (9/10)

2016: (PHILADELPHIA EAGLES – 15/14)

- Played in 15 games (14 starts) and recorded 365 yards and 2 TDs on 36 receptions (10.1 avg.), while adding 14 yards on 5 carries...Also produced 5 KORs for 92 yards
- Led the team with 47 yards on 2 receptions (23.5 avg.), including a season-long 40-yard TD catch, in the 24-19 win vs. NYG (12/22)...Also posted 2 KORs for a career-high 38 yards
- Posted 42 yards on 4 receptions at Chi. (9/19), marking back-to-back games of 40+ yards and 4+ receptions to open the season
- Totaled a season-high 57 yards on 4 receptions (14.3 avg.), including a 35-yard TD reception, in the season opening 29-10 victory vs. Cle. (9/11)

2015: (PHILADELPHIA EAGLES – 13/12)

- Appeared in 13 games (12 starts) in his rookie season, totaling 283 receiving yards and 1 TD on 23 receptions (12.3 avg.)...Was inactive and missed Weeks 6-9 due to an ankle injury
- Caught his first-career TD on a 53-yard pass from QB Sam Bradford in a 23-20 victory vs. Buf. (12/13)...The reception marked the longest TD catch by an Eagles rookie since WR Hank Baskett in 2006 (89 yards – 12/31/06 vs. Atl.)
- Registered 3 receptions for a season-high 64 yards at Was. (10/4)
- Posted his first-career reception for 5 yards in his NFL debut at Atl. (9/14)

— COLLEGE —

- Played three seasons (2012-14) at USC, finishing with 2,565 receiving yards and 20 TDs on 178 receptions (14.4 avg.), becoming the 12th player in program history to amass 2,000 career receiving yards...Added 37 PRs for 540 yards and a school-record 4 PR TDs, as well as 24 KORs for 443 yards...Left USC ranked No. 8 in career receptions (179) and seventh in PR yards (540)
- Led the team with 104 receptions (which then ranked third in USC single-season history) for 1,313 yards (12.6 avg.) and 12 TDs as a senior in 2014, earning AP third-team All-American and first-team All-Pac-12 honors...Became the first player in USC history to post consecutive 200-yard receiving games (at Washington State – 11/1/14 & vs. California – 11/13/14)

- Started 14 games as a sophomore in 2013, posting 56 receptions for 918 yards and 6 TDs, while averaging 19.1 yards per punt return which set a single-season USC record and ranked second-best in the nation...Was second-team All-Pac-12 as a return specialist and honorable mention All-Pac-12 as a receiver
- In 13 games played a true freshman in 2012, posted 19 catches for 340 yards and 2 TDs, while adding 5 KORs for 121 yards
- Majored in communications at USC
- Earned All-America honors as a senior RB, WR, CB and safety...Posted 212 carries for 1,983 yards (9.4 avg.) and 28 TDs, while adding 10 receptions for 117 yards (11.7 avg.) and 2 TDs...Tallied 35 tackles and 3 INTs on defense, while returning 8 punts for 256 yards (32.0 avg.) on special teams
- As a junior in 2010, posted 1,440 total yards of offense, 3 INTs on defense and 323 return yards on special teams, earning All-State, All-County and All-League honors
- As a sophomore in 2009, recorded 970 rushing yards and 15 rushing TDs, while adding 14 receptions for 239 yards (17.1 avg.) and 3 TDs...Posted 31 tackles and 4 INTs on defense
- Registered 1,400 all-purpose yards and 5 INTs as a freshman in 2008
- Also played basketball at Berkeley

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Attended Berkeley Prep (Tampa, FL) HS, where he posted 4,732 rushing yards, 921 receiving yards, 12 INTs and 8 KOR TDs in his high school career
