— KEY TRANSACTIONS —

- Tyler Linderbaum was selected by the Ravens in the first round (25th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft... Was the second of two Ravens' picks (S Kyle Hamilton, 14th) in the round

- PFWA All-Rookie Team (2022)

— CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- Started at center in 15 games for Baltimore in 2023, helping block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing offense (156.6 ypg) and No. 4 scoring offense (28.4 ppg), en route to earning his first-career Pro Bowl nod... The ground game eclipsed 100 yards in all 17 contests, while also setting a single-season franchise record with 26 rushing TDs
- Started at center in all 17 games in 2022, helping block for the NFL's No. 2 rush offense (160.0 ypg), which produced the league's most rushes (88) of 10+ yards and most games (12) with 150+ rushing yards... Became the fourth rookie O-lineman (Jonathan Ogden – 1996; Michael Oher – 2009 & Kelechi Osemele – 2012) in Ravens history to start every game

— PERSONAL —

- In 2021, used money earned from NIL to donate \$30,000 to the University of Iowa Stead Family Children's Hospital
- A gifted athlete, Linderbaum was named the Iowa High School Male Athlete of the Year as a junior... Excelled in football, wrestling, baseball and track & field (shot put and discus) for his high school track team
- Was an excellent high school wrestler... As a senior, ranked third in the state with a 35-3 record... As a junior, ranked fifth in the state with a 53-10 record and memorably defeated Tampa Bay Buccaneers T Tristan Wirfs in a championship match
- Older brother, Logan, wrestled for four years at Minnesota State
- A native of Solon, IA, he grew up just 15 minutes from the University of Iowa campus
- Graduated from Iowa with a degree in enterprise leadership

2023: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 15/15, 2/2)

- Started at center in 15 games, helping block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing offense (156.6 ypg) and No. 4 scoring offense (28.4 ppg), en route to earning his first-career Pro Bowl nod... The ground game eclipsed 100 yards in all 17 contests, while also setting a single-season franchise record with 26 rushing TDs

- Started at center, helping block for a Ravens offense that scored twice through the air and twice on the ground, while producing the third-highest postseason rushing mark (229 yards) in franchise history, in the 34-10 Divisional Playoff win vs. Hou. (1/20/24)
- Started at center, blocking for an offense that produced 491 yards of offense (331 passing & 160 rushing) and a season-high 56 points in the No.-1-seed-clinching 56-19 win vs. Mia. (12/31)... Baltimore's 56 points also marked the second-highest total in franchise history and the most points ever scored at M&T Bank Stadium
- Started at center, blocking for an offense that rushed for 251 yards and 1 TD in the playoff-clinching 23-7 win at Jax. (12/17)... Baltimore's 251 rushing yards marked the 30th-straight game in which the rushing attack eclipsed triple digits, tying for the fourth-longest streak since the 1970 merger
- Started at center, blocking for a rushing attack that produced a season-best 298 yards and 3 TDs in the 37-3 win vs. Sea. (11/5)... Baltimore recorded a season-high 515 total yards and 29 first downs, while its 298 rushing yards marked the fourth-best single-game output in franchise history
- Started at center, helping block for an offense that rushed for 130 yards and scored TDs on all 4 red zone trips, including a career-high 3 rushing TDs by RB Gus Edwards, in the 31-24 win at Ari. (10/29)
- Started at center, helping QB Lamar Jackson complete 21-of-27 passes for a season-high 357 yards and 3 TDs, while adding 1 rushing TD, in the 38-6 win vs. Det. (10/22)... Baltimore recorded 503 total yards and scored a TD on 5 of its 6 red zone possessions

2022: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 17/17, 1/1)

- Started at center in all 17 games, helping block for the NFL's No. 2 rush offense (160.2 ypg), which produced the league's most rushes (88) of 10+ yards and most games (12) with 150+ rushing yards... Became the fourth rookie O-lineman (Jonathan Ogden – 1996; Michael Oher – 2009 & Kelechi Osemele – 2012) in Ravens history to start every game
- Started at center in the 17-9 victory vs. Atl. (12/24), helping block for a rushing attack that posted 184 yards on 34 attempts (5.4 avg.)... Also helped sustain a clean pocket and protect QB Tyler Huntley, who was kept upright all game (no sacks or QBHs allowed)
- Blocked for an offense that eclipsed 150 rushing yards (188) for the eighth-consecutive game and finished 9-of-15 (60%) on third down in the 27-13 win at NO (11/7)
- Helped block for a Ravens rushing attack that gained 211 yards on 24 carries, averaging a single-game franchise-record 8.8 yards per attempt, at NYG (10/16)

- Started at center, blocking on an O-line that helped Baltimore rush for a season-high 188 yards and 1 TD on 26 carries (7.2 avg.) in the 37-26 win at NE (9/25)...Protected QB Lamar Jackson, who produced the second game in NFL history (also QB Randall Cunningham in 1990) with 4 passing TDs, 100 rushing yards and 1 rushing TD
- Started at center, helping QB Lamar Jackson produce 318 passing yards and 119 rushing yards vs. Mia. (9/18)...Jackson threw 3 TDs and ran for another (79 yards), and he set the NFL record for most career 100-yard rushing games (11) by a quarterback
- Made his NFL debut, starting at center in the 24-9 victory at NYJ (9/11)...Helped protect QB Lamar Jackson, who threw for 213 yards and 3 TDs

— COLLEGE —

- Played in 37 career games (35 starts) at Iowa, where in 2021 he was named the Rimington Trophy winner, awarded to the best center in college football
- Was a unanimous All-American as a senior (2021) and twice earned first-team All-Big Ten honors (2020-21) and academic All-Big Ten recognition (2020-21)
- Began his collegiate career as a defensive tackle at Iowa before shifting to the offensive line following his true freshman season (2018)
- His college honors include: Rimington Trophy (best collegiate center) winner (2021); unanimous All-American (2021); first-team All-American by *AP*, FWAA, Walter Camp, *The Sporting News*, AFCA and *Phil Steele* (2021); first-team All-Big Ten (2020-21); Roy Carver Most Valuable Player, Offense (2020-21); team Captain (2020-21); Academic All-Big Ten (2020-21); first-team All-American by *Pro Football Focus* and *The Athletic* (2020); second-team All-American by *AP*, FWAA, Walter Camp and *Phil Steele* (2020); honorable mention All-Big Ten (2019)

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Prepped at Solon (IA) HS, where he was a three-year letterman on the football team, playing along both the offensive and defensive lines
- As a senior captain, was named a U.S. Army All-American and earned first-team All-State as a center...On defense, finished with 37 tackles, 3 TFL and 2 sacks to earn District defensive MVP honors
- Named District MVP as a junior with 44 tackles, 7 TFL and 3 sacks, en route to earning first-team All-State honors as a center
- Earned first-team All-District honors as a sophomore with 27.5 tackles, 6 TFL and 4 sacks
- Also earned four letters in baseball and had a .346 batting average as a junior
- Earned three letters in wrestling and posted a 53-10 record with 41 pins as a junior, finishing fifth in the state tournament in the 285-pound heavyweight division
- Earned three letters in track and placed second in the shot put (59'1) and third in the discus (166'1.75) at the 2018 Class 3A state meet...Also lettered in basketball and golf as a freshman

— LINDERBAUM'S COMMUNITY IMPACT —

- Alongside teammate G Ben Cleveland, went fishing on the Chesapeake Bay with military veterans (2024)
- Participated in a park restoration at Chinguapin Run Park (Baltimore, MD) with volunteers from the Ravens, Coca-Cola Consolidated and Baltimore City Recreation and Parks (2023)
- Participated in the Baltimore Ravens' annual organization-wide volunteer day to build a state-of-the-art playground and provide significant upgrades at Morrell Park Elementary/Middle School and Recreation Center in Baltimore City (2023)... The construction and renovation project marks a \$200,000 community investment fully funded by the Ravens Foundation, Inc., in partnership with KABOOM!, Heart of America, Baltimore City Public Schools and Baltimore City Recreation and Park
- Joined teammates to host a holiday party at St. Vincents Villa, interacting with and serving food to students (2022)
- Participated in Ravens annual Holiday Helpers event at Target to shop for holiday gifts with Baltimore youth in need (2022-23)
- Distributed coats and cold-weather gear to individuals at the Helping Up Mission addiction and homeless shelter (2022-23)
- Joined teammates to distribute Thanksgiving turkeys and sides to community members in Baltimore (2022-23)
- Participated in My Cause My Cleats to benefit The Big O Foundation and raise awareness for youth and teen mental health challenges (2022)
- Joined teammates and Ravens President, Sashi Brown for the ribbon cutting ceremony of the new Ravens-themed playground in Northwest Regional Park (2022)
- Participated in the organization-wide day of service, Caw to Action (2022)
- Participated in the Baltimore Ravens' annual organization-wide volunteer day to establish new educational spaces at Baltimore City's Franklin Square Elementary/Middle School (2022)... Fully funded by the Ravens Foundation, Inc., the \$200,000 investment project featured multiple renovations with the goal to provide inspiring and engaging learning spaces in Baltimore City... The event was coordinated in partnership with Heart of America, a national nonprofit focused on educational equity through space transformation and resource distribution
